Facilities were aging with some nearing the end of their useful life, so Council took a holistic view of its infrastructure, identified participation levels and potential growth areas, and undertook to develop high quality, fit for purpose community infrastructure, capable of catering for the current and future volume of participants.

Campbell Town War Memorial Oval Precinct – All new multi-function centre, meeting rooms, inclusive changerooms (4), carpark/kerbing, lighting; IT facilities; function centre/kitchen; tennis and multi-purpose the squash courts upgrade. courts and hit-up wall; interchange benches; electronic system and tennis pavilion.

Morven Park (Evandale): Installed entrance signage and a storage shed. Development of inclusive changeroom facilities and new cricket nets.

Longford Recreation Ground: Constructed ticket booth, opportunities. umpires' rooms, inclusive changerooms, club rooms, storage shed and amenities; refurbished the main grandstand, the Fred Davies Stand and public amenities; community open space, that Incorporates nature-based new entrance interpretation panels known as the Fred play and a smooth access path, and multi-use shelter Davies memorial entrance.

Longford Sports Centre: Construction of a new gym with toilet and shower facilities, aerobics area, meeting renovation of associated landscaping, office/reception area, entrance, foyer, squash courts, storage area and construction of mezzanine floor.



Cressy Swimming Pool: Renovated kiosk/office, storage area; new complex entrance; new raised sun deck; gel coating of 2 pools, relining of toddler's pool, and new shade structure. Stage two of this project is now underway which includes the concourse upgrade, sealing of the car park and fencing.

Cressy Recreation Ground: Development of inclusive Longford Grand Prix Expo 2023 changeroom facilities for players and umpires, upgrade Northern Midlands Council of clubrooms including roof replacement.

This \$1.07m development was made possible with a \$385.000 contribution from the Australian Governments, Local Roads, and Community Infrastructure Program and the Ross Village Green was formally opened on 23 August.
