#### **6 NEW BUSINESS**

## 6.1 Independent Living Units: Evandale

Letter from Stephanie Kensitt dated 29 May 2024 was read and accepted by the committee. Member request clarification as to if this is social housing for those needing assistance or 'normal' housing and if it is council's role to be involved in 'fixing' the housing crisis? Committee would like to see a business case as to the viability of this project.

# **6.2 Installation of - No Parking on Sundays - signage in Coachmans Road and Saddlers Court Evandale**

## **6.3 MASTER PLAN: PIONEER PARK, EVANDALE**

- Committee would like to see more details on the plan: The landscape plan does not indicate
  the irrigation lines, power outlets, fences, style of the picnic area, wood cubby house and
  gates. Requesting that all these be examined, and the aesthetics be in keeping with the
  heritage nature of the town. Evandale being a tourist destination due to its historic buildings
  and ambience.
- 2. Member provided the Pioneer Park Enhancement Plan that indicated feedback from the Evandale Advisory Committee and letter form Louis Sauer dated 16 February 2023.
- 3. Member noted that the Landscaping Master Plan that was given did not nominate the trees that would be planted. Suggestions were to consider a pathway that would be walking through maple groves.

### **6.4 PIONEER PARK: TOILET BLOCK**

The refurbished toilets look very utilitarian. Members requested that the filigree metal work be put back onto the toilet block. The colour of the toilet building should be dark to retire into the landscape and use of planting surrounding the toilet so that the Pioneer Park itself is the dominant quality from Russel Street view. See the Pioneer Park Enhancement Plan feedback and letter dated 16 February 2024 from Louis Sauer.
