9.2 Rubbish Bins around the Football Oval.

The committee requested 4-5 additional bins placed around the perimeter of the oval and 3 more large wheelie bins at the pavilion.

Background:

After the football matches the bins are overflowing bins which show the need for additional bins and rubbish around the perimeter of the oval. They believe there are inadequate bins spaced around the oval. These matches are held for 13-15 Saturdays of the year.

9.3 Previous Ambulance Station House, Elizabeth Court

House has been vacant for 8-10 years now. Hospitals need housing for locum doctors. This would provide the support needed for the hospital to attract doctors and nurses. Council to write letter of support to lobby for use for Campbell Town Hospital

9.4 Ticket Box at the Recreation Ground entrance.
