Evandale Bike Rack – location and style options

11th April 2025

The Evandale District Committee (EDC) has been asked to present the Northern Midlands Council with options for the locations and styles of bicycle racks for installation in Evandale.

Currently, footpaths on Russell Street are frequently obstructed by cyclists leaving bikes in the way of personal mobility scooters and wheelchairs when visiting the cafés on Russel St.

To inform EDC views, some Members have approached local businesses and the various bike riders that visit the village to determine the best options regarding the nature of preferred racks and locations.

The EDC has considered the needs of the ‘lycra’ cyclists who usually visit the Village for short times and, as importantly, the growing number of touring cyclists. The ‘lycra’ cyclists prefer to have their bikes close by where they can see them while enjoying refreshments at local businesses.

The touring cyclists, who may spend several hours in the village, are more likely to secure their bikes while they explore and support local businesses. While they might leave their bikes secure and unattended, they would want them to be in a reasonably public view.

It is important to mention that, while the majority of EDC Members support the installation of appropriately designed and located bike racks and rails, some are very concerned about the visual impact these structures might have on the heritage streetscape. There is a general view that thoughtful design and use of appropriate materials can maximise the integrity of the streetscape while still supporting cyclists and local businesses.

Proposed location for consideration, in order of preference. See attached map and design option:

1. 14 RUSSELL STREET – Evandale Café

On the front footpath, both sides of the existing tree, a simple bike ‘rail’ to run parallel to the footpath – but set back an adequate distance to allow for opening of car doors. Is it envisaged that this rail could be of a heritage design and in a material that complements the style of existing streetlamps.

2. 4 RUSSELL STREET – Ingleside

On the front footpath, between the existing tree and the Glover advertising signpost, a simple bike ‘rail’ to run parallel to the footpath – but set back an adequate distance to allow for opening of car doors. Is it envisaged that this rail could be of a heritage design and in a material that complements the style of existing streetlamps.

3. 9 RUSSELL STREET - Time Traveller park area

Behind the low hedge on the left of the Map stand, either against the fence, or parallel to the road directly behind the hedge. The EDM suggests that his be rack be designed to complement the penny farthing history of the Village – as per attached - see attached photo.

4. PIONEER PARK ENTRANCE – Russell Street

Just inside the Pioneer Park Entrance, on the left side, either against the side fence, or behind the front fence parallel with the road. It is preferred that this would be a bike rack with heritage penny farthing ends and several wheel slots between the ends - see attached photo.

If these sites are found to be inappropriate, and no other sites on Russel Street are agreed on, the other option could be on the front lawn of the Evandale Community Centre on Barclay Street – however this location is unlikely to support the local businesses to the same extent as positioning racks in Russell Street.
