COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE: ROSS, CAMPBELL TOWN AND LONGFORD PROJECTS UNDERWAY

Several exciting projects across the Northern Midlands are progressing well, delivering improved facilities, recreation, and accessibility for our communities.

ROSS QUARTER COURT BASKETBALL - NEARING COMPLETION

In Ross, the new quarter court basketball facility is almost finished. This welcoming space will offer young people and families a safe, fun, and active place to gather and play. The court supports healthy, active lifestyles and strengthens community connections. The Children's playground at the Campbell Town Recreation Ground is waiting on some finishing touches and landscaping. The four quarter basketball courts in Perth, Cressy, Longford and Ross and the Campbell Town Children's playground were funded through the State Government's Open Spaces Program Round One.

ROSS MENS SHED - FOUNDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE

Construction of the Ross Men's Shed is progressing steadily. More than just a workshop space, the new facility will include accessible toilets and amenities for broader community benefit. This project promotes social inclusion, learning, and wellbeing—key goals of Council's Strategic Plan 2021–2027. Funding from this upgrade was provided by the Australian Government's Investing in Communities Program, by local group donations and the Northern Midlands Council.





LONGFORD SHARED PATHWAYS - CONNECTING COMMUNITY

Work is also progressing on the shared pathways along Union Street to the rail bridge and through Carins Park in Longford. These pathways will provide safer, more accessible walking and cycling routes for residents and visitors. This important infrastructure is being delivered with funding support from the Australian Government's Community Development Grants Program, helping improve connectivity and encourage active transport within our towns.

RECENT MEETING SNAPSHOTS

Council works in partnership with local District Committees in towns across the Northern Midlands. These committees bring together residents, representatives from community interest groups, local organisations, and business owners to help guide and inform Council of local priorities.

LONGFORD DISTRICT COMMITTEE

MEETING SNAPSHOT

Signage & Promotion

 Longford Roundabout Signage: Delays continue due to State Growth conditions, including the proposed removal of the historic stone "Longford" wall. The committee strongly objects to its removal and relocation.

Environment & Safety

 Heavy Vehicle Access (A/B-Doubles): Concerns raised about 24/7 access through Longford due to impact on heritage buildings. Awaiting further clarification from the Minister.

Town Improvements

- Longford Cemetery: Some upgrades underway (roses, soil, irrigation), but shade trees and additional seating still requested.
- Neighbourhood House Proposal: NMC pursuing acquisition of the old police station for community use. Community support and funding are being explored.

Sub-Committee Reports

- Railway Committee: Bridge pillar construction underway; Model Railway Expo planned for July 26–27.
- Longford Legends: New concrete path being constructed.
- Town Hall: Minor repairs and assessment for solar panel viability ongoing.
- Arts & Culture: New exhibition scheduled for early August.

Other Notable Issues

- Longford Post Office: Monitoring national closures—local vigilance encouraged.
- Macquarie River Bridge Signage: Request for signage at Woolmers Lane supported by committee.
