WILLIAM STREET TO COMMONWEALTH LANE (AUGUST 2025)

- 1 New southbound bus stop location
- 2 Service Station access to be entrance only
- 3 Service Station access to be exit only
- 4 Angled parking to be replaced with parallel parking
- 5 Forecourt to be constructed outside of Town Hall
- 6 New trees to be planted along High Street
- 7 Footpaths to be widened and landscaped
- 8 Northbound bus stop location
- 9 Existing pedestrian crossings to be upgraded
- 10 New pedestrian crossing and traffic island

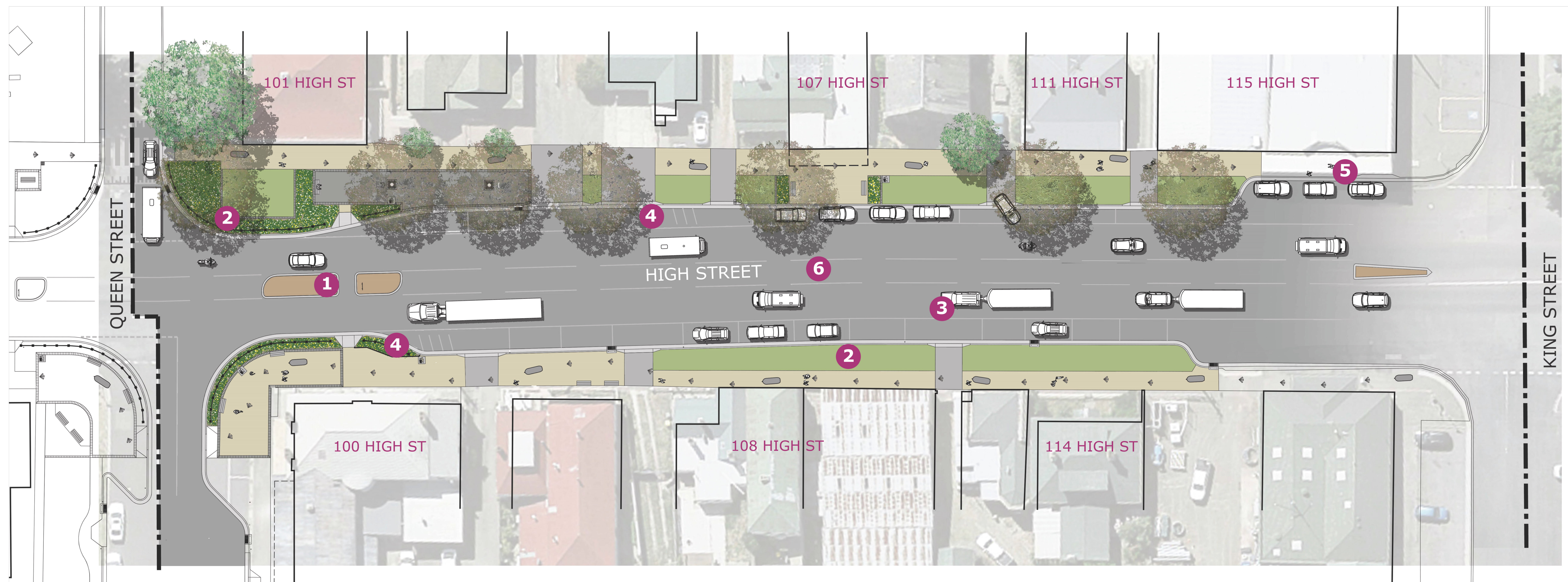

- 3 New line marking to be installed
- 4 New motorcycle parking
- 5 Indented parking to be installed
- 6 Informal pedestrian crossings and traffic islands to be removed
