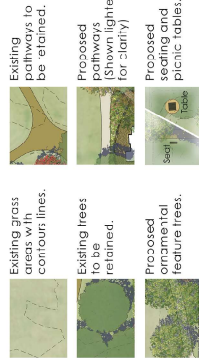


PIONEER PARK ENHANCEMENT PLAN

This landscape master plan illustrates proposed opportunities within Pioneer Park to enhance the usability and enjoyment for the Evandale community. Generally, the plan protects the heritage values of the park whilst proposing and reorganising public amenities and additional parkland inclusions.

Northern Midlands Council and the Evandale Advisory Committee welcomed community feedback on this master plan. The results of which ensure Pioneer Park is improved and managed in a manner that best accommodates the community and visitors beyond 2050.

LEGEND

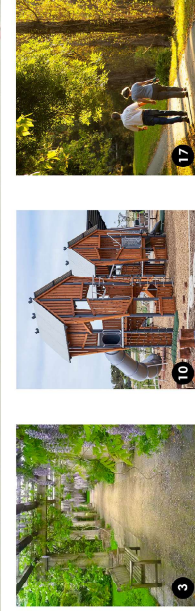


NUMBER LEGEND

- Existing fences at the Russell Street entry to be removed and new low gardens created to provide a welcoming entry.
- Existing toilet facility to be refurbished inside and out, including the addition of a circular garden in front for aesthetics.
- Potential for a grandstand with multi-coloured Wisteria vines for seasonal displays. The Airbar would provide the ideal area for interpretation panels about the early pioneers of Evandale.
- 5m x 5m picnic shelter overlooking the open lawn area and within close proximity to Russell Street and toilet facilities.
- Potential for a fenced community garden with accessible garden beds, dwarf fruit trees, compost bins and shelter.
- Additional connector pathway to create a centralised seating area under the existing trees.
- Existing Donadee Garden. Opportunity for interpretation on Donadee and their relationship with Evandale.
- Existing central open grassed area to be retained.
- Existing playground to be replaced with a semi-circle lawn area with a 5m x 8m picnic and BBQ shelter.
- Proposed inclusive playground for children from 2-14 years and to accommodate passive and active play activities. Play elements would include a large log scramble, large cubby structure with swings and slides. Nature based play areas will be created for children to learn about the local environment. This will provide a safe and seasonal change throughout the year.
- 5m x 8m picnic and BBQ shelter, adjoining the play area offers picnic facilities for birthday parties and parties for a group activities.
- Existing pathway to be realigned to provide a safer space for walking and a better connection to the new looped pathway.
- Existing picnic facilities to be fully removed.
- New inclusive toilet facility with baby change facilities close to the medical centre, open space and the play area.
- New loop pathway connecting the memorial hall and the medical centre with the surrounding streets. A designated pedestrian crossing would link the hall entry area to the park.
- Open space area to be refurbished to provide a leveled and usable grassed area to accommodate large scale community events.
- Proposed pathway loops around the open space area, and connects back into the existing pathway.



- Potential to formalise pathway link to Barclay Street, the information centre and Marven Park.
- New fence to provide security for the adjoining public housing units. Gardens on the east side of this fence provides colour, form and texture within the park.
- Existing pathway through the Pioneer Cemetery and link to Murray Street to be retained.
- Existing open space to be retained.
- Potential for 15 parallel parking bays with shade trees. A concrete pathway along side the parking bays provides all weather access and connections to adjoining streets.
- Potential pathway linking Murray Street and Russell Street, via the memorial rose garden.
- Opportunity for a new off-street car park for over-flow parking during community events.
- Opportunity for way-finding signage at the Rodgers Lane entry to assist visitors in navigating their way around the park.
